From the Commodore — John Smith



Hi All,

The past quarter included the Christmas period and we were prepared for a busy time with our vessel on the water and ready to go if required. However the early part of the quarter turned out to be very quiet probably because the weather did not prove all that inviting for most of the boating fraternity.

The last week of the holidays brought a change and we were tasked with a number of activations including a few Medivacs including a patient transfer in rough conditions in the northern bay. A number of break downs required tows back to Urangan.

We have a newly qualified coxswain who has also gained her commercial qualification. In the couple of weeks since gaining her qualification, she has certainly had a baptism of fire with several medivacs and a couple of difficult tows. She also had a Search & Rescue & subsequent tow for a vessel with a child on board who was experiencing a diabetic episode. It was necessary for us to seek permission from the Rescue Coordination Centre (RCC) in Canberra to activate the vessels EPIRB to enable us to locate the vessel in distress.

We are moving forward with our strategic plan in focus. HBVMR has recently purchased an ex Police RHIB (Rigid Hull Inflatable Boat) and we will start to access its capabilities once it is fully operational. Our replacement Primary Rescue vessel is still in the drawing stage so we are about a month behind with this project.

Membership in HBVMR is on the increase and we now have about 110 Working Members.

2017 Radio Course Starts 13th May



If you have a VHF radio on your boat, someone on board must have a licence to use it.

The Office of Maritime Communications at the Australian Maritime College is responsible for the management of marine radio examinations and certification services in Australia.

At VMR Hervey Bay, we hold regular training courses and supervise the examination necessary for you to gain your radio qualification.

We train and examine two courses:

Short Range Operator Certificate of Proficiency - SROCP (VHF use only)

Long Range Operator Certificate of Proficiency - LROCP (VHF & Long distance MF/HF, working on commercial vessels, volunteering at VMR)

The next date for the courses and examination (for both of the above) is the 13th May.

The course starts at 08:30am and takes approx. 3½ hours to complete. You then sit the exam which takes up to an hour.

The course is free for VMR members, but for non-members we charge a \$60 admin fee.

The Office of Maritime Communications charges an examination fee of \$83 which everyone has to pay.

MSQ GETTING INTO MOVIES - FOR SAFETY'S SAKE!

Everybody loves a good video and our take-up of social media grows by the day. Combine the two skilfully and you've got a potentially very effective, low-cost way of getting important information out to massive numbers of people.

With this and its safety objectives in mind, Maritime Safety Queensland (MSQ) has recently made its first forays into filming maritime safety messages for broadcast via social media and websites.

"Maritime Minutes" are short, punchy video excursions into topics aimed at that most basic of boating imperatives – ensuring that when boaties go out on the water they also return to dry land.

Using the knowledge and personalities of its own staff in boating settings, aided by skilled and helpful volunteers and using relatively inexpensive filming and editing technologies, MSQ has so far produced three instalments in a series of videos it calls "Maritime Minutes". These have covered topics like vessel maintenance, the importance of reporting marine incidents, and lifejackets and children. A fourth video, on the International Regulations for Preventing Collisions at Sea, is in production.

Let's face it – at first glance these are not topics guaranteed to set the average boatie's pulse racing. While boaties intuitively know they are important, traditional methods of communicating them – for instance posters, brochures, fact sheets or a page of information on a website – don't necessarily grab their attention and make them read.

So, while MSQ has not abandoned traditional methods, it no longer expects them to do the job all by themselves. MSQ will still produce a range of traditional materials for our safety educational messaging, and they will have their audience — Old Salts, after all, are a tough and stubborn breed who do not bend easily in any wind, let alone the winds of change. But we must also factor societal changes into our thinking.

Consider these raw numbers. Social media platforms Facebook and YouTube, to name just two, had 16 million and 14.8 million users respectively in Australia In January, 2017*. They and other social media are hungry for visual content and enable us to share it with our networks of friends at the click of a mouse or the tap of a screen. If we can produce an attractive video or photograph with a well-thought-out message conveyed in an interesting way, these platforms can be a great way to reach a large number of people in a very short space of time.

What's more, the quality of video footage that can now be captured on inexpensive devices including mobile phones, and the availability of software to edit it with, puts the ability to make engaging short videos at our fingertips with a little imagination and planning.

Maritime Safety Queensland is by no means expert at the medium yet. If it has any Spielbergs or Nicole Kidmans among its staff, it has not yet discovered them. But the agency thinks that's not a problem, because we boaties would probably prefer to see and hear important, common-sense safety information imparted by people like them.

So MSQ has featured its own marine officers and content experts such as workshop manager and head mechanic Ben Kirby in its *Maritime Minutes* so far. It's also why MSQ will be looking for partners in other willing and capable organisations such as Volunteer Marine Rescue from time to time. That makes sense - VMR staff are passionate about boating, have a wealth of knowledge about it and are respected by the boating public – so don't be surprised if you get tapped on the shoulder by MSQ to appear in *Maritime Minutes* soon.



VMR Crew Training

The Hervey Bay VMR Rescue boats are registered commercial vessels. As such they are required to be maintained to marine survey standards. The crew also have to meet training qualifications as set down by the Australian Maritime Safety Authority (AMSA). When new members join VMR, they are required to complete a training course which usually takes about 2 months before they can become provisional crew on the vessels. This course is known as "Elements of Shipboard Safety".

The initial training is all about safety – what to do in the event of a fire or other emergency on a boat, how to prolong life if you have to abandon ship, wearing lifejackets and using liferafts, use of marine radios, flares and EPIRBs. Trainees also learn to proficiently tie knots and handle lines, and to launch, retrieve and refuel the vessels. The training begins with theory (and exams) in the classroom and is then reinforced with many practical exercises.


